Training is carried out in steps, rather than one long session – mirroring how the participants would normally execute their projects.

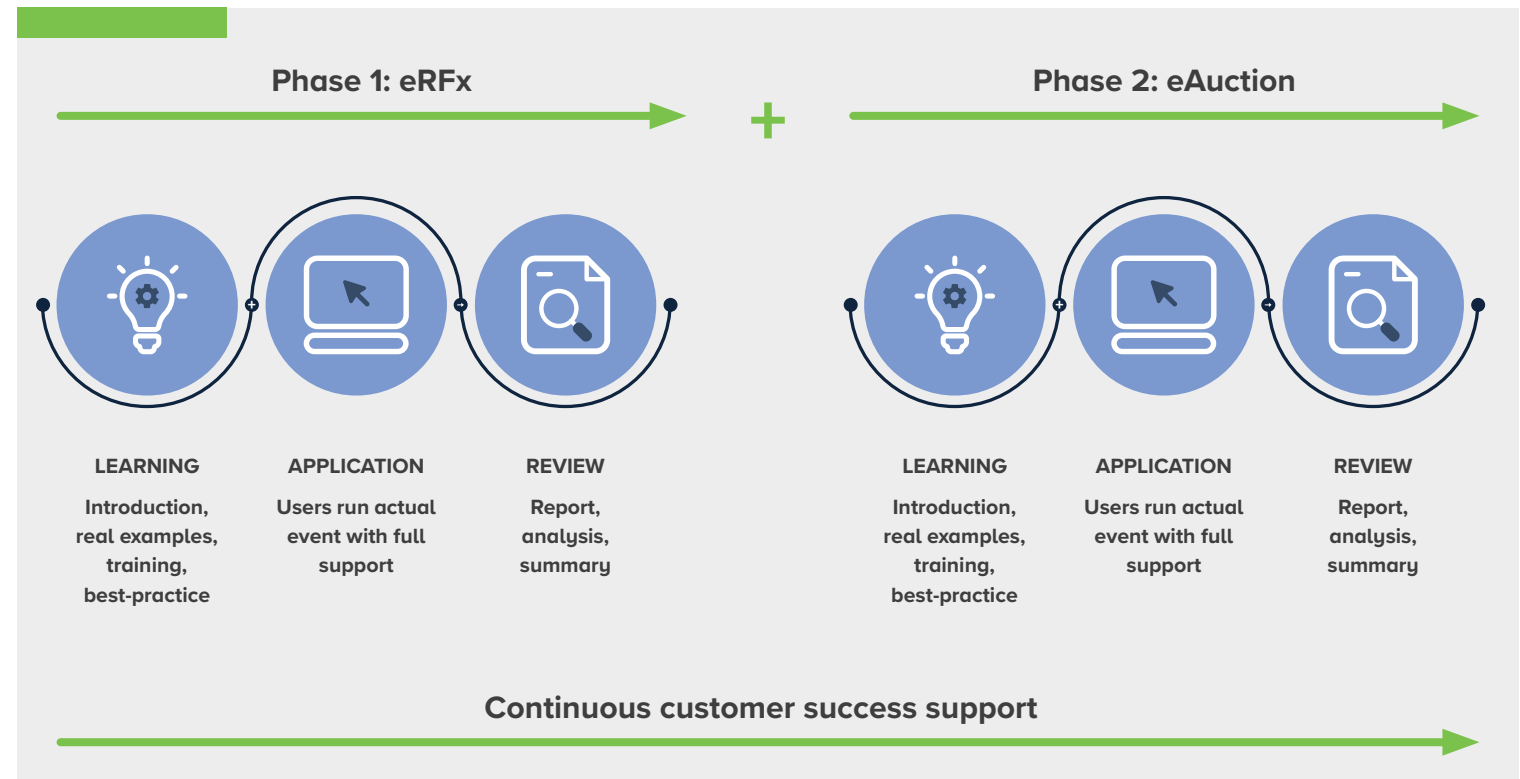
Learning by doing

A phased structure for eRFx

The project phases include several virtual training sessions, followed by practical applications, and then review loops, enabling an active approach to learning.

Project phases



With one-to-one consultancy support, buyers begin their own RFI/RFQ events directly in the system.
